

Hi Everybody,

Our USDAA (United States Dog Agility Association) competition of October 3 & 4, is only 2 weekends away! This is the most challenging of all the agility venues, as the courses require strategy, the jumps are higher and the a-frame for large dogs is 6'3". We are having a Dog Agility Masters Tournament, with some very fast dogs with skilled handlers participating. If you want to see agility at it's finest, this is the show to come and watch!

It will be at the Mosaic Arena in the Manatee County Fairgrounds. This is a beautiful covered horse arena with great bleachers. The directions from I-75: Take exit 224 (old 43) onto US 301 westbound. It becomes 10th St. W. in Palmetto. Continue to 14th Ave. You will cross US 41 and business 41. Turn right onto 14th Ave. and continue to the fairground entrance on your right. We will be starting a 8AM both Saturday and Sunday, and will probably continue through 4PM.

This is also the most labor intensive of all the shows I put on and we will specially need helpers for setting up on Friday. We will load the truck at 11AM after the Agility class, and in this venue ALL the equipment goes! We especially need help desperately setting up the rings at the arena. Both my sons will be helping on Saturday, but they have to work on Friday. Everyone that helps load up will get a 4 week class card. Everyone that comes to the arena and helps us set up the rings will get an 8 week class card. If you want to get a front row seat at this event plus free lunch, come help us during the show. We need people to set up jumps, straighten the chute, move the dog's leads from one gate to the other, as well as many other jobs...we will train you!!!

No Classes

There will be no classes Monday, September 21, thru Monday, September 28. I will be going to Tennessee to the NADAC Championships. We will not have small dog agility classes on Tuesday, September 29. The grass will probably VERY high and we might lose one of those little dogs!

A Boxer's (or any dog) Job...From Debbie White

BATHROOMS - Always accompany guests to the bath room. It is not necessary to do anything. Just sit & stare.

DOORS - Do not allow any closed doors ... in any room. To get the door opened, stand on hind legs & hammer with forepaws. Once door is opened, it's not necessary to use it. After you have ordered an outside door opened, stand half-way in & out & think about several things. This is particularly important during very cold weather, rain, snow, or mosquito season.

CHAIRS AND RUGS - If you have to throw up, get to an upholstered chair quickly ... jump up in their favorite comfy recliner if possible. Or if you cannot manage in time, get to an Oriental rug. If there is no Oriental rug, shag is good. When throwing up on the carpet, make sure you back up so it's as long as a human's bare foot.

HAMPERING - If one of your humans is engaged in any activity, and the other is idle, stay with the busy one. This is called helping, otherwise known as hampering. Following are the rules for hampering:

When supervising cooking, sit just behind the left heel of the cook. You cannot be seen and thereby stand a better chance of being stepped on and then having your human drop to their knees to comfort you and give you a yummy.

For book readers, get in close under the chin, between eyes and book --unless you can lie across the book itself and use it as a pillow.

When human is working at computer, do everything possible to distract them, including putting your head in their lap, then your front legs, then

climb up into their lap, and lay in human's lap across arms, hampering any possible typing in progress.

WALKING - As often as possible, dart quickly & as close as possible in front of the human... especially on stairs, when they have something in their arms, in the dark & when they first get up in the morning. This will help their co-ordination skills.

BEDTIME - Always sleep on the human at night so he/she cannot move around. Also shift positions every ten minutes or so, and stretch and groan loudly every time you move. And don't forget to snore loudly.
